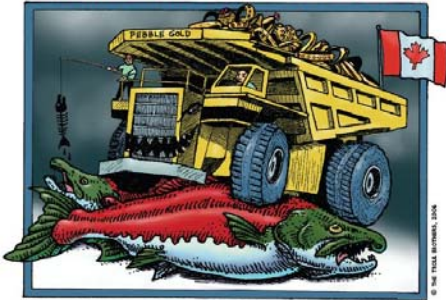

Bristol Bay Quick Fact



Combined annual sockeye salmon runs to the Bristol Bay, Alaska commercial salmon fishery have averaged 39 million fish for the last 10 years, with nine river systems producing approximately 98% of all returning sockeye salmon: Kvichak, Alagnak, Naknek, Egigik, Ugashik, Togiak, Wood, Igushik, and Nushagak Rivers. Historically, the Kvichak stock was the largest contributor to the harvest.

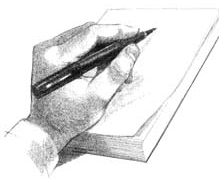
